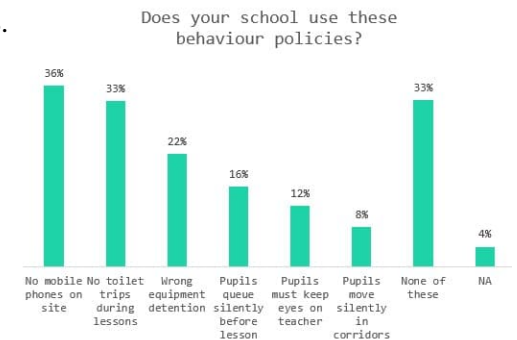


Shhh ?... Silent Corridors Are In Vogue
